India - Labour Codes: A Political Analysis

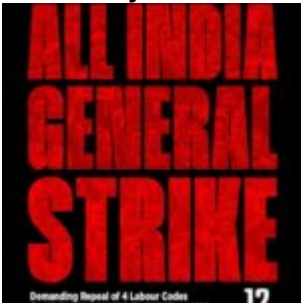

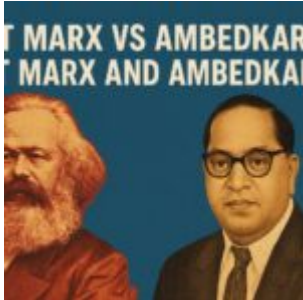
